OVERVIEW

This seminar will feature the work of leading scholars in public law, at varying stages of their careers, including in constitutional law, theory, and history; administrative law; legislation; federal courts; law and religion; gender, sexuality, reproduction, and the family; and other statutory and regulatory subjects. Scholars will present works in progress to students and YLS faculty. Students will meet in seminar to discuss the paper and other related work. The seminar is designed to expose students to contemporary ideas, concerns, and problems in American public law, as well as to the academic craft, including by highlighting developments in thought across generations. Students will engage in scholarly writing, either in the form of short essays or, with approval of the instructors, their own research paper.

Course Application Information: Please submit a short statement explaining your interest in the course and identifying any relevant experience, either academic or practical, that you bring. Please also include a resume.

OVERVIEW

This seminar will explore strategic and doctrinal issues related to bringing impact litigation to defend and advance civil and constitutional rights in today's legal environment. The course will draw on the instructor's decades of experience litigating immigration and civil rights law reform and class action cases in federal courts nationwide as founder and director of the ACLU Immigrants Rights' Project and on serving in senior policy positions in the Obama and Biden administrations. The course aims to explore the intersection of theory and practice in the context of various civil rights issues, including immigrants' rights, separation of powers, voting rights, police misconduct, LGBTQI equality, labor, environmental justice, and other social justice areas. The emphasis may be on suits against the federal government but litigation against states and localities (as well as private entities) will also be discussed. Topics will include bringing test cases, doctrinal restrictions on standing and class actions, strategic pleading, structural reform litigation, the role of amicus briefs, suits for damages versus injunctive relief, settlement strategies and issues, coalition litigation, public advocacy and media, ethical considerations, and the role/perspective of government lawyers. A number of guests with a range of views and extensive substantive expertise in different areas will be invited. A paper is required and substantial writing credit may be possible for a very limited number of students. No previous courses required; familiarity with constitutional issues is assumed. Open only to JD students.

Course Application Information: In addition to listing this course among permission-of-instructor selections, students interested must submit a short statement of interest (300 words maximum) by 4:30 pm on the last day of the bidding period. The statement should discuss your interest in the course, in civil rights litigation, and any specific issues or topics you would especially like to explore. You may include a discussion of any relevant experience. The goal of the seminar is to have students with a diversity of substantive interests and experiences who want to explore the role and practice of impact litigation.

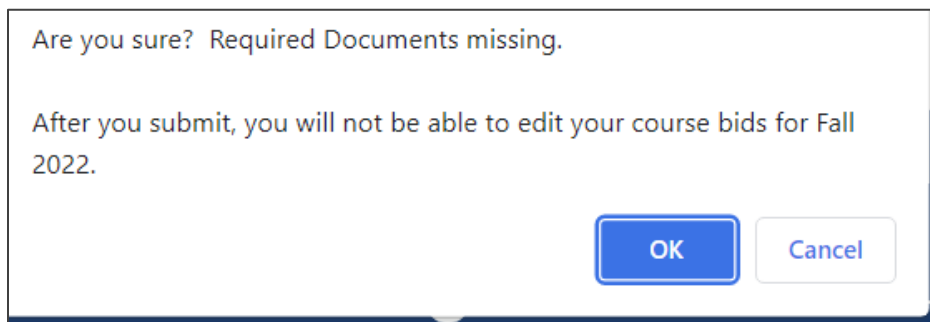

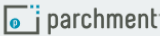
