Data and Democracy at Work: Advanced Information Technologies, Labor Law, and the New Working Class



Brishen Rogers is a Professor of Law at Georgetown University Law Center, where he teaches Labor Law, Employment Law, Torts, and Critical Legal Theory. His scholarship focuses on how labor and employment laws shape class formation processes, especially among low-wage and marginalized workers. His book *Data and Democracy at Work* (MIT Press, 2023) shows how employers have used novel information technologies to erode workers' power. Rogers' current research explores how worker's knowledge of the law contributes to the recent upsurge in unionization.
