Hossam Bahgat has spent the last 25 years working as a human rights defender and investigative journalist in Egypt. With a background in political science and international human rights law, he was founding executive director of the Egyptian Initiative for Personal Rights (EIPR) in 2002, and recently returned to lead the organization since 2021. Bahgat previously served as board chair of the International Network for Economic, Social, and Cultural Rights (ESCR-Net) and board member of the Fund for Global Human Rights. He is a recipient of Human Rights Watch's Allison Des Forges Award for Extraordinary Activism, the Catherine and George Alexander Law Prize from Santa Clara University, and the Anna Politkovskaya Award for Courageous Journalism. Because of his activism, the Egyptian government has placed Bahgat under a travel ban for the last seven years.
